It's that time of the year again...March Madness. Next to the Super Bowl, this event stimulates the most sports wagering in the U.S. During 2004, the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) conducted a national survey of gambling and other high risk behaviors among college athletes, which is described in a number of publications or reports. This survey revealed that college athletes (especially males) evidenced sports betting despite the NCAA rules prohibiting

student-athletes from wagering on college or professional sports. During 2008, the NCAA conducted a subsequent national study of student-athletes. This reviews some preliminary findings of the 2008 NCAA study.

The Conference focus is on responsible gambling and social responsibility within the gaming industry or in a broader context.

Content is broken into two streams: one that is industry-based and focused on responsible gambling and corporate social responsibility, and another that addresses community interests, research, education and prevention.

The overall goal of the two-day event is to ensure that every attendee leaves with new knowledge about responsible gambling and social responsibility within the industry, and beyond.

Deadline for submissions is Friday, March 19th, 2010.
